10. Respecting Match Officials

Late last autumn, the second National Rugby Survey was completed with responses from over 14,000 coaches, players and match officials. A 'cut' of the data was requested that focused on the responses of match officials – their biggest concern was spectator behaviour. Interestingly, a similar response was found amongst players and coaches.

The point made is that spectator behaviour, and that of parents of age-grade players, is not just a referee problem alone; it is a problem for our Game as a whole and needs to be tackled as such. We hope that Driffield RUFC will be a place where our spectators respect the officials, without whom the game cannot continue.
