Subs for all members are now due, and can be paid by the methods described above. Please remember that playing members are not covered by the RFU insurance until they have paid in full for the season, or have set up a Standing Order to cover the full subs.

Please remember that we will reactivate your member's discount card once you have paid for the coming season – any balance is held on the card until then.

6. Pre-Match Lunches

There is still availability of tables for home games this season, with seats at £30 (incl. VAT) each. Because there are so many derby games, they are selling fast so we recommend that you call the office soon to book a table.

The Ladies Day lunch on Saturday, 22 September sold out very quickly, so anyone who missed out may want to book tables on another day?
