Although government guidelines at the time did not restrict us from running the event, the Committee felt that the surge in Covid cases at the time meant that postponing the game was the best thing for players and supporters alike.

We are looking to re-schedule the match for Easter weekend.

6. The Touch Union

The RFU's new non-contact format of the game - The Touch Union - is officially launching this month with equipment, resources and webinars ready to go. The format is fun, fast flowing and social, while still building on the core rugby union skills - perfect for any age or playing ability.

7. League Restructure

The RFU has committed to changing the leagues that our Ist XV play in, reducing them from I4 teams to I2 and introducing meaningful cup and knockout rugby tournaments that will take place after the end of the shortened league season. The aim is to flatten the existing pyramid of leagues to relieve pressure on amateur players, and should be in place for the 2022/23 season.

The national review asked players what they wanted from the game. Players who responded to the survey overwhelmingly wanted a reduction in the number of competitive games and less time spent travelling.
