6. England Autumn Internationals 2022

8. And finally ... Season's Statistics 2021-22

This is a summary of senior rugby played by Driffield RUFC in the 2021-22 season:





What's happening at the Rugby Club?

- 99 games were played, of which 65 were won by Driffield there were 3 draws
- 220 senior Driffield players took to the pitches
- A total of 1,841 'appearances' were made, either in the starting line-up or as a replacement
- Our players scored 2,899 points :
 - o 434 tries
 - o 270 conversions
 - o 63 penalties, and
 - 0 drop goals
- Top scorers were:
 - Overall: James Watts with 237, just beating Colin Lucas with 236
 - o Try-scorers : Alice Calvert with 22
 - Kicks at goal: Colin Lucas with 211 (77 conversions and 19 penalties) beating James Watts on 202 (65 conversions and 24 penalties)
