9. Disclosure Service Notifications

For a few seasons now, it has been a requirement in RFU Regulation 21 that all individuals wishing to engage in age grade rugby are required to have completed the RFU's eLearning Introduction to Safeguarding course.

To drive compliance and ensure those engaged in the children's workforce have (at a minimum) some basic safeguarding awareness, the Game Management System (GMS) has been updated to block any DBS application against an RFU ID/record that does not show this as an active course award.



The RFU acknowledges there may be individuals with a higher level of safeguarding training through other courses or in their personal/professional lives. However, the block on GMS cannot be overridden and therefore requires all individuals needing a DBS check to complete this prior to an application being initiated.

As we move through the summer, and you are involved in coaching, please check that you have completed this course, and make sure you have completed it if not. The eLearning Introduction to Safeguarding course can be accessed on the GMS Course Finder, at

12. And finally ... Season's Statistics 2022-23

This is a summary of senior rugby played by Driffield RUFC in the 2022-23 season :

- 99 senior games were played (the same as last season), of which 66 were won by Driffield there were 3 draws
- 200 senior Driffield players took to the pitches
- A total of 1,891 'appearances' were made, either in the starting line-up or as a replacement
- Our players scored 3,303 points :
 - o 492 tries
 - o 315 conversions
 - o 71 penalties, and
 - 0 drop goals
- Top scorers were:
 - Overall : James Watts with 264
